Quiz answers

- 1. Clinical appraisal and revalidation:** Answer: True – participation in national clinical audit can be used to evidence quality improvement in GMC appraisal. New guidance on this was published by HQIP in June 2017
- 1. Stroke care:** Answer: C - 72
The number of days on which stroke inpatients receive physio increased from 54.3% to 71.6%, findings from the latest Sentinel Stroke National Audit showed.
- 2. National clinical audit benchmarking** Answer: True – hospital Trusts now have results benchmarked for 6 national clinical audits, including lung cancer, hip fracture and intensive care.
The National Clinical Audit Benchmarking (NCAB) platform is a search engine on the HQIP website. Trust results are RAG-rated against 6 national standards for each audit. These are also now used in CQC inspection packs.
- 3. Vascular surgery:** Answer: C –following abdominal aneurysm treatment, patient mortality rates fell year-on-year by 0.6% in 2016, from 2.2% to 1.6%, according to the National Vascular Registry Annual Report.
- 4. Improving care for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease:**
Answer: A – 130 Trusts or Health Boards in England and Wales submitted improvement action plans following the last COPD secondary care audit.
- 5. Joint replacement in women and men** Hips, knees, ankles, shoulders and elbows: according to latest National Joint Registry figures, only one of those five joints has majority male patients. Which is it?
Answer: C – Ankles. Hip, knee, shoulder and elbow replacements are all majority-female patients
